business continuity and disaster preparedness. EHNAC requirements include the following:

STANDARDS SUPPORT	
Standards support	All HIPAA-required and industry-standard formats must be supported
Customer support	 Specific metrics must be measured with stated minimums met on an ongoing basis. Ticketing system must be in place with prioritization and documented escalation procedures.
Transaction processing	 Assurance that the proverbial "black hole" does not exist: Every transaction must be accountable from the time received until the time delivered.
System availability	 Formal capacity plans and disaster recovery plans are required.
Resiliency and Disaster Recovery	 Recovery Point Objectives (RPO) and Recovery Time Objectives (RTO) must be specified within the required timeframes, and demonstration must be made that these can be met. Must conduct at least annual testing of the recovery plan.
Business Practices	 Accreditation requirements must not be diluted through remarketing white labeling. Fairness must be demonstrated in use of "only method" network connections.
Employee Requirements	 Specific workforce training, initial and annual, must be formalized with ongoing compliance documented.
Facility and System Planning	 Formal management and planning of physical and computing resources is required.
Third Party Accountability	 Outsourcing never eliminates need for direct review of the outsourcer (each must be interviewed and facilitate a site review). All immediate third parties handling PHI must be visited, with the exception of FedRAMP-certified Cloud Service Providers (CSPs). The use of Fed RAMP-certified CSPs requires completion of cloud criteria requirements. Overseas outsourcers must be documented and, depending on access PHI visited.
Organizational focus	 EHNAC does not permit scope to be limited to a production environment, but requires that supporting operations, development, and quality assurance be included within scope.

organizational privacy, security and cybersecurity controls while delivering improved PHI data

management, and compliance with 21st Century Cures and other state and local requirements. With the foundation of EHNAC accreditation, Zane Networks is uniquely positioned to work with clients to implement regulatory compliant practice quality improvements, workflow redesign, revenue cycle enhancements and other business practice and policy improvements. We believe EHNAC accreditation is an important step in remaining competitive; working with clients to avoid potential exclusion from future business opportunities requiring certification; and mitigating the risk of breach of Protected Health Information (PHI).

Going forward, EHNAC and Zane Networks will be incorporating the requirements of the 21st Century Cures Act, and its implementing Trusted Exchange Framework and Common Agreement (TEFCA), to facilitate the secure exchange of PHI consistent with evolving landscape of federal and state security requirements. In addition, Zane Networks is part of EHNAC's leadership team, as Mr. Luigi Leblanc, Vice President, Technology is a Commissioner for the EHNAC which affords him of view of the evolutions in cyberhealth security policy at the national level.


Eula Secka

HELPFUL TAX TIPS BEFORE YEAR END

Tax planning can be more advantageous when done during the year and well in advance of year's end.

Opportunities may exist for you to minimize tax liability, which could leave more income for you and/or your family.

Generally, people put off tax planning because paying income taxes is an obligation. So, this "negative" view causes frustration. It is often simpler to say, "Let's see how everything shakes out between

January 1 and April 15." However, after December 31, all you can do is deal with your tax liability. On the other hand, if you take care of the tax planning now, you may save more on April 15.

Do a trial tax return based on your projected personal income and deductions. Afterward, adjust your W-4 Form accordingly.

If you expect to have income that is not subject to withholding, review your required quarterly estimated tax payments. If you fail to have enough tax withheld or make sufficient estimated tax payments by the end of the year, you may be subject to penalties and interest. Adjust your W-4 or estimated payments to make up any shortfall.

Always keep an eye on what is happening in Congress. Tax reform is an ongoing process, and there may be more changes ahead.


If you can control when you receive income or take deductions, consider deferring income into next year if you expect to be in a lower tax bracket. Likewise, accelerate your deductions if you expect to be in a higher tax bracket this year as opposed to next. If you expect a tax change for the upcoming year, you may want to revisit this issue.

Watch out for the alternative minimum tax (AMT) if you expect to have any large tax items this year such as depreciation deductions, tax-exempt interest, or charitable contributions. To avoid the AMT, consider strategies such as re-positioning assets or delaying charitable contributions.

However, if you are subject to the AMT, consider accelerating next year's income into this year if your regular tax bracket would be higher than the AMT rate. If your itemized deductions increase the likelihood of triggering the AMT and do not generate significant tax savings, consider postponing deductions into next year if you are subject to the AMT this year.


