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Cybersecurity Tip

Ransomware attack vectors can include phishing campaign emails that ask you to download an attachment, click an embedded link or call a support number. Basic protection against ransomware can start with proactive actions against those phishing emails. Here are some tips to assist you:

Phishing Email

- Beware of any subject line that indicates a sense of urgency.
- Do not trust the sender's name; check the email address to confirm the sender's identity.
- Pay attention to any spelling or grammatical errors, foreign characters or anything in the email that is suspicious.

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Omnibus Care Plan and Patient Referral for the Prince George's County PreventionLink Project



ZaneNet was awarded a contract to customize the Omnibus Care Plan (OCP) application to facilitate referrals for patients enrolled in the Prince George's County Department of Health's PreventionLink program. The PreventionLink program integrates clinical practice with evidence-based public health programs to improve health outcomes for patients at all levels of risk for chronic disease, from persons at risk for diabetes and heart disease to high-system utilizers with frequent hospitalizations. Innovations in the use of health information technology and the development of communities of practice bring together stakeholders in chronic disease care with a shared goal of reducing the burden of diabetes, hypertension, and stroke in underserved areas of Prince George's, St. Mary's, Charles, and Calvert counties.

The OCP is a secure, cloud hosted application infrastructure that has embraced the FHIR standard environment. Using this standard, SAMHSA created the OCP which is a SoF infrastructure to support care coordination, care management, screening, and consent management. The OCP was envisioned from the beginning to support a care team, patient centered approach. The OCP facilitates a multi-practitioner, multiorganization approach to patient centered care. In other words, the OCP facilitates practitioners from multiple organizations to participate in the care associated with a patient. This eliminates the need for data to be shipped from place to place in providing the care the patient requires. The Care Team has immediate access to patient information in one place without having to manage many separate electronic sources of patient data. ZaneNet has worked with members of the County's Department of Health to ensure that the OCP application can be leveraged to share important health information for PreventionLink patients to better coordinate and access care. The County intends to utilize the application in April as part of their program.


Our 2020 Virtual Sip and Paint Holiday Party

This experience lead to the DC HIE Connectivity work that started in 2019 under a grant from DHCF. Again, in the role of Technical Assistance. Michelle worked with individual providers. Using her experience from the PTN project, she was able to quickly find similar patterns with the providers and their needs. This allowed her to help drive the HIE team toward meeting their initial goals, troubleshooting barriers, expanding the work to address these barriers, and shifting as directed by DHCF to continue this work during the COVID-19 Pandemic.

In December of 2019, Michelle began work on the Omnibus Care Plan, OCP, project. The OCP is an Open Source, FHIR Compliant case management platform that Zane is developing to meet the needs of multiple clients. Michelle is acting as a clinical analyst to the project, using her years of clinical and health IT experience to help guide the development of the OCP for the individual stakeholders. The OCP effort has landed 2 clients and continues to expand with RFP submissions and an NIH SBIR grant proposal, for which Michelle will act, if granted, as the Principal Investigator.

Zane Networks has seen the value in Michelle's experience and created a position to optimize her


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WELCOME TO ZANENET—OUR NEW CFO/ **ACCOUNTANT TEAM MEMBERS**

- Hover over the link to verify the web address before clicking.
- If the email is asking you to call a support number; Google the company's support number to verify the number.
- Check the email signature line.
- If in doubt, **DO NOT** download any attachments; contact your IT administrator.
- Finally, always backup your files.
